Key Challenges and Opportunities from State Interviews

 Challenges: Adequate pipeline infrastructure, storage management, local impacts and evolving regulatory requirements

 Opportunities: tremendous economic and workforce development, access to chemical markets, storage infrastructure and compressed natural gas vehicles



Straw Man MGA Work Plan on Natural Gas Generation

• Information sharing:

- Economic & workforce development. The MGA region can share information and generate strategies on how the region's economy and workforce can benefit from natural gas development.
- Regulatory development. MGA states can learn from other states within and outside the region with natural gas development experience. Ohio, in particular, highlighted the opportunity to learn from other states, business experts, and regulators' experience in states with more mature natural gas development industries.
- Local impacts (e.g., sand mining). MGA states can learn from each other about how states are working with local communities on topics such as sand mining for hydraulic fracturing.



Straw Man MGA Work Plan on Natural Gas Generation

- Infrastructure development (e.g., pipelines and storage).
 - Michigan points to the Midwest Independent System
 Operator as an example of multi-state coordination and planning for energy infrastructure.

• Delegation visits to other states

 Learning opportunities in other states to apply to states within our region.

 - Workforce development
 - Social impacts
 - Supporting the related business development through regional economic development
